Following is information shared at the Milwaukee Police Department District 7 Crime & Safety Meeting:

- 1. During the winter months, vehicle thefts increase. This is primarily due to people starting their vehicles to warm them, and going back into the house. Some people will start their vehicle with the key and use the key fob to lock the door. If your key is in the ignition, they will break the window and take your vehicle. The best option is to warm the car while you are in it.
- 2. During this time of the year, robberies increase. This is primarily due to holiday shopping and people not being attentive to their environment and watchful regarding who is coming and going around them.
- 3. Hondas are the number one car being stolen in Police District 7.
- 4. Be mindful that people are stealing packages that are delivered to homes and are not brought inside right away.
- 5. A car was blocking the street talking to someone. After waiting some time, the car behind them blew their horn. The car that was blocking the street eventually moved over, then followed the car that blew their horn at them. After traveling a couple of blocks, the car that was blocking the street fired shots at the car that blew their horn. Thankfully no one was hit.

Even though everything in our world has changed, unfortunately, human nature has not. For this holiday season, please make sure that you **BE SMART, BE SAFE, BE SERIOUS.**

MAKE A FAMILY SMILE TURKEY DRIVE

Milwaukee – Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. said "life's most persistent and urgent question is, What are you doing for others?". In November the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Center and the We Care Crew will be answering that question with the "Make a Family Smile Turkey Drive".

On Tuesday, November 24th the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Center and the We Care Crew will host a drive through COVID-safe turkey drive at the Ling Community Center to provide turkeys and winter resources to families, with a goal of serving 1,500 families.

The Thanksgiving event at the King Community Center began nine years ago, when Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Center Manager, Dee McCollum bought 10 baskets filled with holiday foods and other items using her own money. Serving as a member of the Diversity Committee of Milwaukee County, Dee was able to spearhead efforts to grow the event, and over the past decade, the King Center has served over 5000 families with a Thanksgiving meal. The last couple of years, Dee partnered with Elizabeth Coggs and began serving a complete sit-down thanksgiving meal the Tuesday before thanksgiving for families to enjoy prior to picking up their turkey. Elizabeth took on the task of cooking all the food for over 1000 people.

Due to COVID-19 this year's event will not include a sit-down dinner, but families in need will still be able to receive a donated turkey for their family meal, as well as the resource kits, at a drive-thru event on November 24, from 10:00am until supplies run out.
