TITLE: MY GOD CAN DO IT AND MY GOD WILL DO IT

INTRODUCTION

- A. The difference between **CAN** and **WILL**
 - 1. Can is a statement of Ability The ability that it can be done
 - 2. Will is a statement of Certainty *The certainty that it will be done*
- B. Examples:
 - 1. I can come over on Saturday to help you rake leaves vs. I will come over on Saturday to help rake leaves
 - 2. I can wash the dishes for you vs. I will wash the dishes for you
- C. The difference between **CAN** and **WILL** relating to God
 - 1. God can solve this problem with my coworker vs. God will solve this problem with my coworker
 - 2. God can give me peace in this chaos vs. God will give me peace in this chaos
- D. I have the faith to believe that God CAN do it. However, do I have the faith to believe that God WILL do it?
- E. Mark 9:22-24, ²² "...But if You can do anything, have compassion on us and help us." ²³ Jesus said to him, "If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes." ²⁴ Immediately the father of the child cried out and said with tears, "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!"
 - 1. "If You can do anything..."
 - a. *If*???
 - b. How can we use "Jesus"/"God" and "If" in the same sentence?
 - 2. Jesus' response #1
 - a. "If you can believe"
 - b. All things are possible to those who believes
 - 3. Jesus' response #2
 - a. "If you can believe"
 - b. All things are possible to those who believes
 - 4. We resolve to Jesus, "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief"
 - a. How can we believe and have unbelief at the same time?
 - b. It is the difference between what Jesus "Can do" and what Jesus "Will do".
