



DEALING WITH DISTRACTIONS: FOCUS ON JESUS

The window in my office overlooks 38th Street through some trees. Often, while I am working at my desk, I will look up and out of the window and see a car drive by, or someone walking their dog down the street, or someone at a neighbor’s house, or a squirrel jumping from branch to branch, or a bird nibbling on a piece of bread it picked up from the sidewalk, or... well, you get the point.

Once distracted, I may get up to get coffee, check my phone for messages, open a letter, etc., and spend the next 15 or 20 minutes doing something that could have waited for later. The distraction diverted my attention away from the important matter that I was working on to something usually less important. As a result of my time, which I generally do not have, and my attention being taken away from what I was working on, I must borrow time, which I still do not have, and attention from something else to compensate for the time that I wasted.

The devil is very aware that he cannot stop us from accomplishing God’s purpose and plan for us. However, the devil is also very aware of the power of distractions. Distractions divert our attention away from the more or most important things. Even worse, the devil will use distractions to divert our

attention away from God (the most important thing) to something else less important thereby altering and adjusting our outcomes.

In Luke 10:38-42, Jesus is in the house – speak, however, Martha is so distracted by things that she believes is important that she does not consider how important it is to hear Jesus’ words. Many of us, like Martha, become so distracted with what needs to get done that we do not take sacrifice the time to sit with the one who has everything that we need to get it done

May we adopt the model of Mary and fully utilize the opportunity we have to sit at Jesus’ feet and hear Jesus’ words. Yes, we have invited Jesus into the house. Now that Jesus is in the house, what are we going to do?
