A.	For superheroes and superheroines, different things preceded the exercise of their power
B.	The Disciples were with Jesus every single day, witnessing everything that Jesus did – with power
C.	One day, after witnessing Jesus praying, one of the disciples asked, "Lord, teach us to pray"
D.	This is the only thing the Disciples asked Jesus to teach them. They never asked Jesus to teach them to: 1. Walk on water 2. Cast out demons 3. Heal the sick 4. Raise the dead
E.	Why?, "Lord, teach us to pray"
	Walking On Water (Matthew 14:22-25) 1. Why did Jesus walk on water? There was no other way to get to the other side 2. Prayer Precedes Power
В.	Casting Out Demons (Mark 1:35-39; 9:29) 1. Jesus cast out what kept people in bondage 2. Prayer Precedes Power
C.	Healing The Sick (Luke 5:15, 16) 1. Jesus healed so people could lead productive lives 2. Prayer Preceded Power
D.	Raising The Dead (John 11:41-44) 1. Jesus brought new live into what was dead 2. Prayer Preceded Power
