- 1. Challenging times are certain. 3. But, during times of challenge you *can* be secure.
- 2. Challenging times can be swift. 4. And the fourth is this: Making it through is promised to us.
- C. So, then, how do we Live? Hold to our professions and declarations about God and about us.
  - 1. ..."but you (God) are the same" Our profession verse 27
  - 2. ..."Your years have no end..." Our profession verse 28
  - 3. ... "The children of your servants shall live secure" Our declaration verse 28
  - 4. ... "Their offspring shall be established in your presence." Our declaration verse 28
- D. But to be "secure" and "established "

f. 1931 – "I'll Fly Away"

- 1. In Psalm 102:28, the phrase "established" means to be securely rooted in God's love and purpose. The verse expresses a hope that God's promises will extend, also, to future generations, ot just the present one.
