#### THE BLESSING OF NOT PLAYING IT SAFE AND TAKING THE RISK

- A. Because the woman did not play it safe and took the risk, Jesus adjusted His agenda
  - 1. After four failures, Jesus delivered her daughter, "O woman, great *is* your faith! Let it be to you as you desire"
  - 2. Not playing it safe and taking the risk is an expression of faith

- B. As we do not play it safe and take the risk, Jesus will adjust His agenda
  - 1. The number of times that you fail is not important

  - Just persist one more time over the number of failures
     My failures do not define me nor describe me. Rather, they develop me
